



## Health and Social Value Programme: Update February 2014

We are over four months into the first year of the health and social value programme and it has been really exciting for us to meet you all and see the great progress that has already taken place in your areas.

As part of the programme, all four areas have had at least two facilitated sessions, a 'diagnostic' and 'expert' session, these have been designed flexibly to respond to the needs of each area, the core cross-sector group nominated from your area will also be meeting (if they haven't already done so) to consolidate and drive the actions forward.

We wanted to take the opportunity to update you with what's been happening in each of the areas as well as share the presentations from some of the expert sessions. Over the coming months, you will continue to have access to these experts and others depending on what support you need to take your social value work forward.

In May we will begin recruiting a second cohort of four areas who will follow the same programme of support as you are. So we will be gathering some feedback from you about how we can develop and improve the programme.
